Life in and around the Waikato

Waikato is the fourth-largest region in New Zealand, stretching 25,000 square kilometres from the Bombay Hills in the north, Raglan to the west, the Kaimai Range in the east, and Lake Taupō to the south.

Waikato has a rich history and a diverse population of around 500,000 people.

One of the best things about living in Waikato is the proximity to a diverse range of activities. Explore nearby beaches, mountains, rivers, and the green countryside. Visit Hamilton Gardens, the Waikato Museum, or weekly farmers and craft markets.

World-class sporting venues and facilities are nearby, including Lake Karapiro, the Waikato River Trail, the Avantidrome, Seddon Park, and FMG Stadium Waikato. The Waikato region is home to the Waitomo Caves, Hobbiton, and Sanctuary Mountain Maungatautari.

Rotokauri Campus

You will be based at one of our two campuses in Hamilton or one of our delivery sites around the Waikato.

Hamilton City Campus

The historic City Campus offers easy access to food outlets, retail shops, the Waikato River, Lake Rotorua, and public transport. Highlights of the Campus include the Gallagher Hub, Atrium, and Te Kōpū Mānia o Kirikiriroa (the Wintec Marae). Foundation, Nursing, Health, Education, Business, IT and Media Arts are some of the programmes taught here.

Hamilton Rotokauri Campus

Our Rotokauri Campus, a short 15-minute drive from the City Campus, is located in the northwestern part of Hamilton and has plenty of green space with purpose-built facilities. The Campus includes a library, basketball court and a café. Programmes taught here include sport science, trades, engineering, animal technology, horticulture, and hospitality, plus many more.



Student Support Services



Studying away from your home country is an exciting opportunity, and we want to make it as easy for you as possible. Our International team will support you as you settle into your new learning environment and the wider community. They can assist you in finding somewhere to live, help you understand New Zealand's culture and customs, and offer pastoral care and support.

Library

The Gallagher Hub at the City Campus has computers for you to use 24-hours-a day, seven days a week. Both campuses have laptop dispensers where you can access a loan laptop to use around campus (including in class) for up to four hours. We understand the international student journey and care about your success and wellbeing.

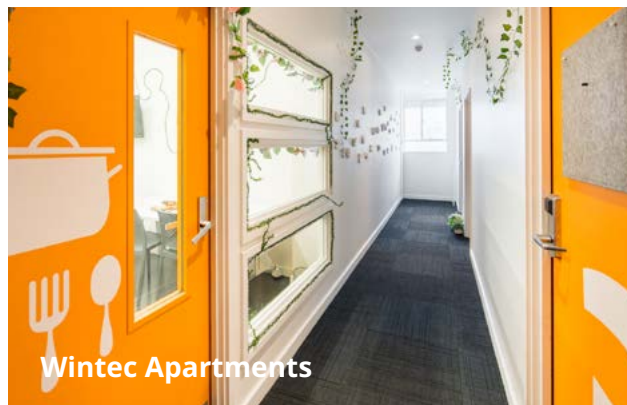
Networking, Employment and Volunteers

Qualification Levels

The New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) is comprised of ten levels and covers a range of qualifications from certificates to doctoral degrees. The levels are based on how complex the learning is; with level 1 being the most basic, through to level 10 being the most complex.

Certificate Level 1–6 Certificates are awarded in a variety of subjects at a range of levels and may be of differing lengths.	Diploma Level 5–7 Diplomas awarded are usually at a higher level than certificates and are 1–2 years in length.	Bachelor's Level 7 A bachelor's is awarded for advanced study that concentrates on general principles and essential knowledge. They are usually 3–4 years in length.	Honours, Graduate, Postgraduate Level 7–8 These programmes are for study after the completion of an initial degree and are ideal if you want to broaden your existing knowledge or retrain in areas of demand.	Master's Level 9 A master's is awarded for study beyond an initial degree and will generally involve a combination of intensive study and supervised research. The next step is a doctoral degree Level 10.
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Entry Requirements

There are set minimum requirements for academic entry to programmes for international students. To view academic entry requirements by country, visit wintec.ac.nz/international/how-to-apply and scroll down to entry requirements or scan the QR code.

How can I gain entry to a course?

Every programme has a set of entry criteria. These criteria are designed to ensure the level of complexity of the course fits your experience and knowledge base. How you gain entry may be based on what you completed at school, your on-the-job experience, or whether you have already studied at another institution. If you cannot gain entry with the experience or qualifications you have to-date, we also offer pathway courses (otherwise known as bridging or foundation studies). These help people gain entry into courses, who might not have the right experience or schooling to get started.

Entry based on secondary school achievement or equivalent

Entry requires you to have completed study at a New Zealand secondary school, either through NCEA or the prior system or equivalent.

Entry based on tertiary study achievement

Entry is gained based on what you have already studied within a tertiary environment.

On-the-job experience

Entry is gained based on your work experience. It acknowledges the relevant knowledge, skills, and experience that will help you be successful in the programme.

English language requirements

These requirements are outlined on the web page of each course and are designed to ensure you have the right level of English competency to meet the needs of the course.

How to Apply

Applying to Wintec is easy. You can submit an application directly OR through an agent. Simply visit [wintec.ac.nz/international/ how-to-apply](https://wintec.ac.nz/international/how-to-apply) and scroll down to international students or scan the QR code.

Applying Directly:

Please send to our admission team:

- The International Application form. This is available by scanning the QR code on this page.
- Verified or notarised supporting documents. You can learn more about supporting documents by scanning the QR code.
- When you hear back from us, your offer may be “unconditional”, which means your offer is confirmed and nothing additional is required. Alternatively, it may say “conditional”, which means you have an offer; however, we still require more information from you before it can be confirmed (this might be exam results, supporting documents, or other information). Our team will keep you up-to-date through the application journey so you know exactly what you need to provide us with and when.

Applying Through an Agent:

Your agent will arrange for your completed International Application Form to be sent to Wintec, as well as verified or notarised supporting documents. You can learn more about supporting documents by scanning the QR code.

Please complete ALL sections of the International Application form, attach the required verified documentation and sign and date the declaration at the end. As programmes are very popular, please apply early while spaces are still available.

Enrolment:

Once you have received an Offer of Place from us, you must accept your place by returning the signed Acceptance of Offer along with the payment of your tuition fees, so that we can start the enrolment process.

Preparing for Study: We offer information and resources online about general student support, as well as specifics for you about your timetable, your first day, and other key information. Look out for emails from Wintec that will update you with key information as you get closer to starting your study.

Please note:

It is compulsory for all international students to have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while studying in New Zealand. It is a Wintec requirement for international students to be covered from the day the student leaves their home country to the expiry date of their Visa plus one week. Proof of current medical and travel insurance is required before your enrolment can be finalised.



Our Programmes

We offer a range of degrees, pathways and programmes, that have been created with academic and business experts for the purpose of making you an employable graduate. Additionally, our programmes are tailored to the specific needs of international students. Classes are taught in English but there are staff available who speak other languages if you need some extra support.






Foundation

Foundation courses are ideal for people who want to enhance their employment and study opportunities.

They are suitable if you do not meet the entry requirements for a specific programme or have been out of study for a long time. You will graduate ready to progress straight into your next programme with the confidence to use the skills you have developed.



New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Social and Community Services) (Level 4)

This one-year programme equips you with the knowledge, skills, and practical experience to support individuals, families, and whānau in social and community services.

Choose from two strands and complete 200 practicum hours in your chosen area:

Flexible delivery options include on-campus, online, or blended learning.

Graduates can pursue roles in mental health, community development, and residential care, or progress to higher-level study.

Full-time: One semester



Start date: February or July

This programme is an excellent starting point for those interested in caring for animals in environments such as pet stores, rescue centres, and boarding or day-care facilities. You'll gain practical experience through 40 hours of work placement at Wintec Animal House, a purpose-built facility for companion animals.

Study topics include animal biology, health and hygiene, animal behaviour, and welfare and ethics. Combining hands-on learning with animal care theory, this programme will help you build confidence and industry networks while preparing for a rewarding career in animal care.

Hamilton Rotokauri Campus



Full-time: One year



Start date: February

Prepare for a rewarding career in rural animal healthcare with this hands-on programme. Gain the skills to work with rural animals through 240 hours of work placement in rural or mixed veterinary clinics. Learn to assist veterinarians and farm owners with animal care, including injury treatment, disease prevention, hoof care, and breeding and production support.

Study combines lectures, practical sessions, and work placements to build your expertise and industry networks. Graduates can work as rural animal technicians or assist veterinarians in mixed animal practices.

In this programme, you will develop advanced skills in the care, management, handling, and nursing of companion animals in clinical environments.

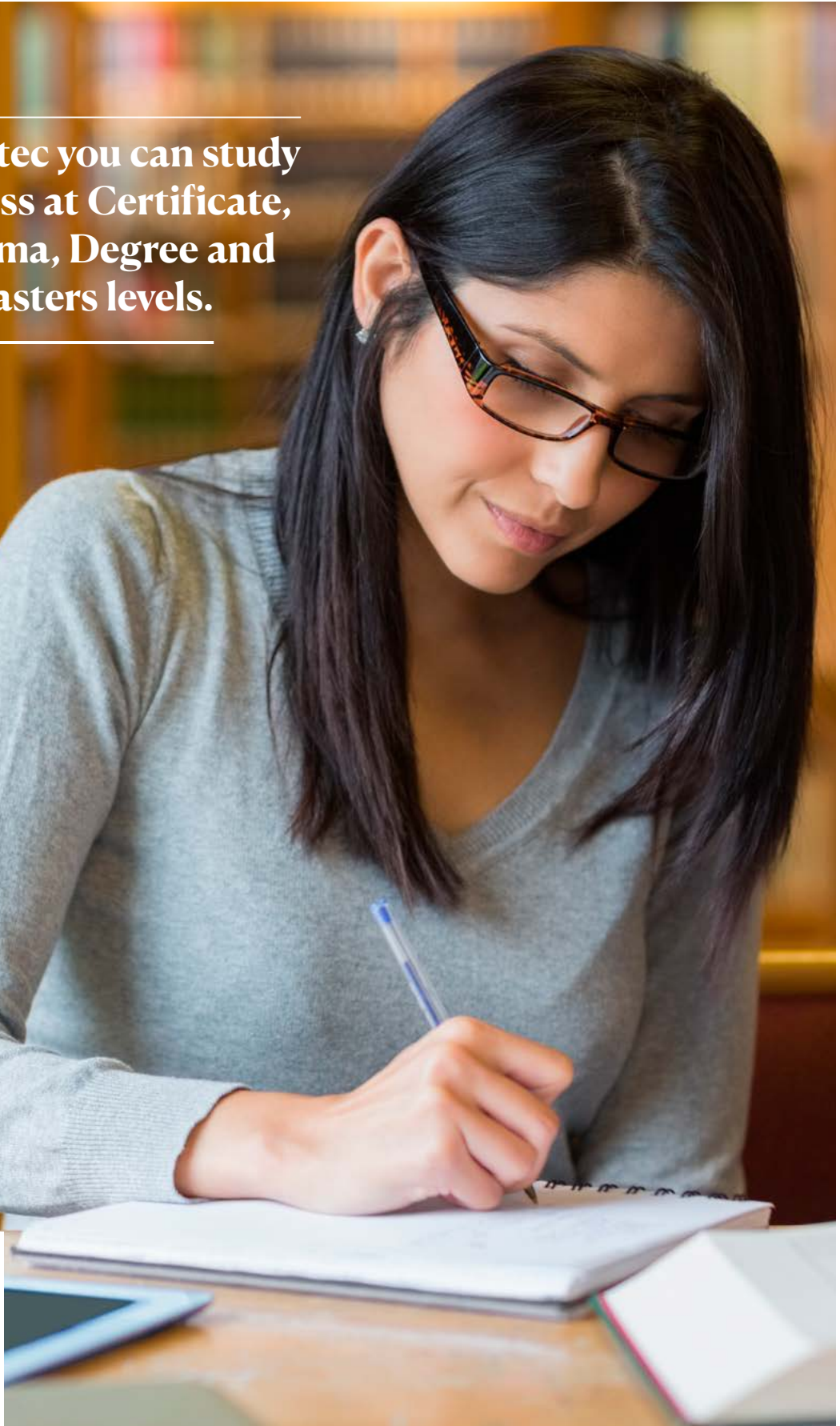

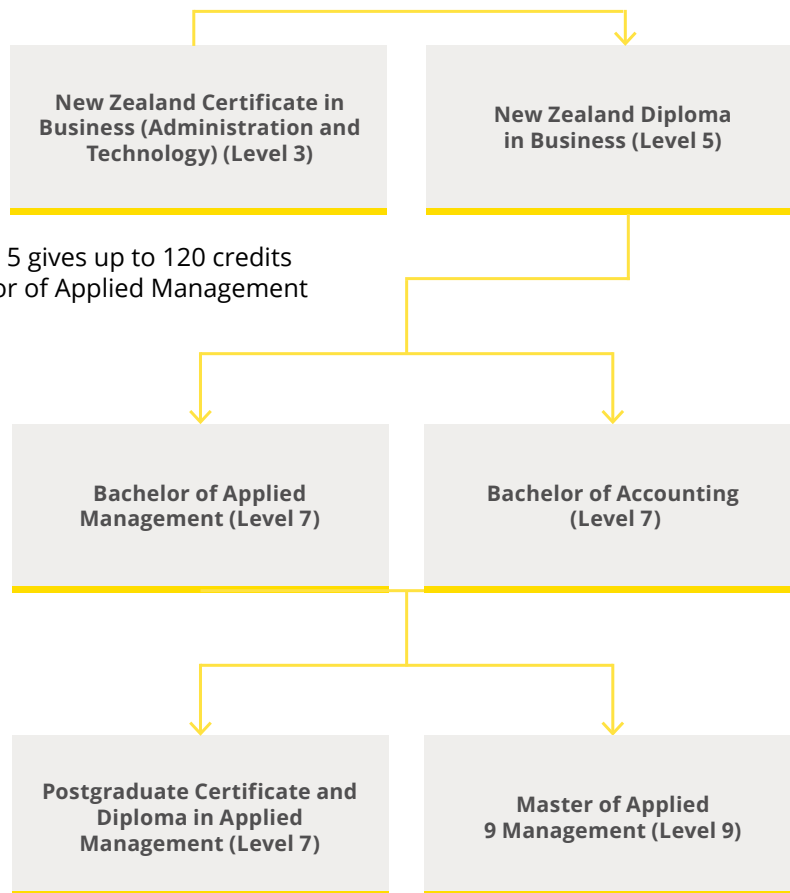

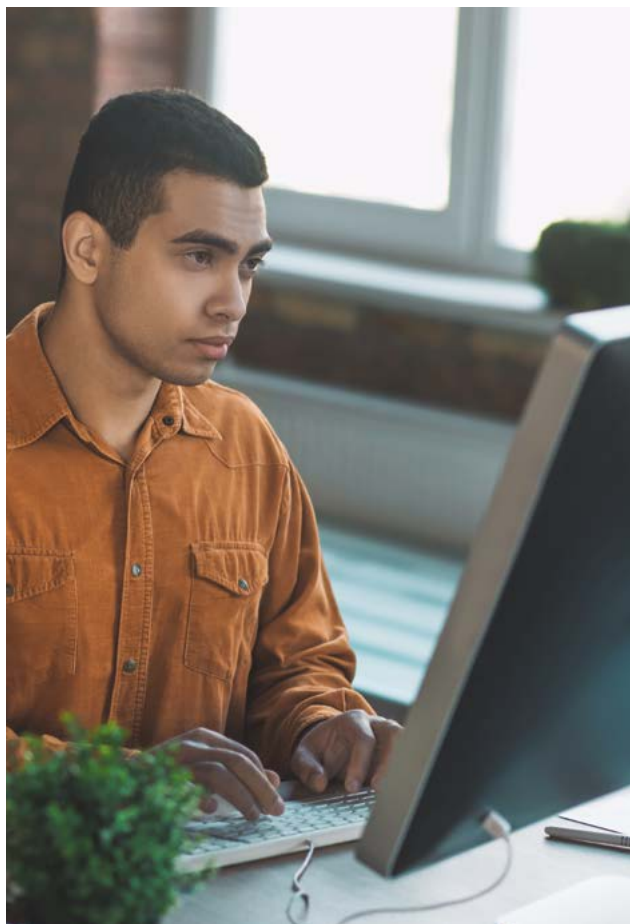

Bachelor of Applied Management (Level 7)



Hamilton City Campus



Full-time: Three years



Start date: February or July

The Bachelor of Applied Management is a comprehensive three-year degree designed to equip students with the practical skills and specialist knowledge needed to excel in today's dynamic business environment. With a flexible structure, this programme is suitable for full-time study and working professionals balancing study with their commitments.

Students develop a broad understanding of business through eight core modules in their first year, then specialise in areas such as Human Resource Management, Operations and Production Management, Strategic Management, or Supply Chain Logistics in their second and third years. Practical learning is emphasised, including Applied Work Integrated Learning (AWIL), where students gain industry experience and complete research projects to enhance employment opportunities.

Bachelor of Accounting (Level 7)



Hamilton City Campus



Full-time: Three years



Start date: February or July

The Bachelor of Accounting programme combines the theory and practice of accountancy with a focus on ethics, social responsibility, and sustainability. This degree prepares students to provide expert financial advice to businesses and organisations. Students explore accounting topics through applied learning, covering core business and accounting modules. In the final year, students undertake Applied Work Integrated Learning (AWIL), gaining hands-on experience through a professional accounting project with a local business.

This programme is accredited by Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ) and Certified Practising Accountants Australia (CPA), providing a pathway to becoming a chartered accountant. Graduates are prepared for roles such as auditor, tax accountant, financial controller, or business consultant.

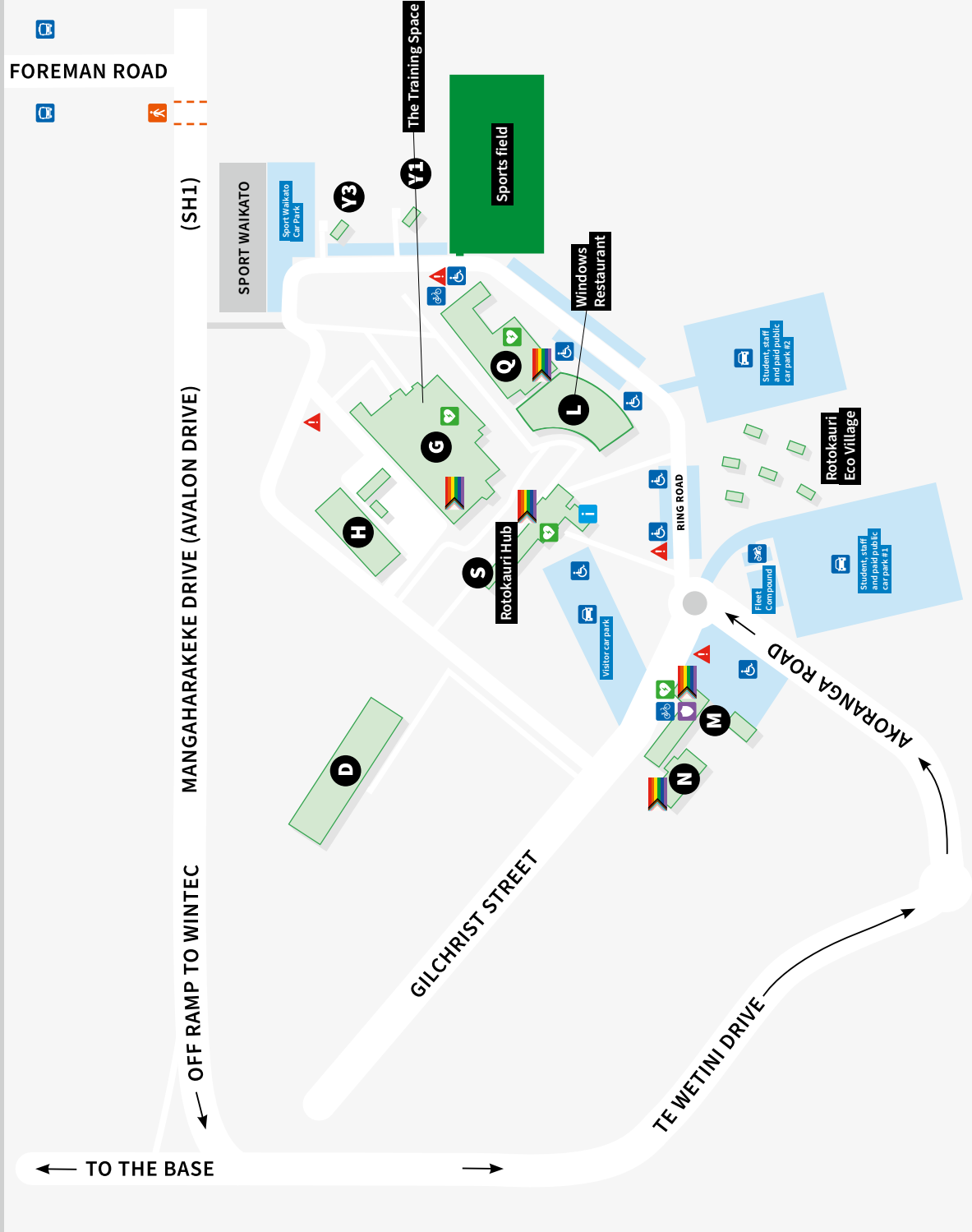

Glossary

Would you like to understand the terms used within this Prospectus better? Here is an explanation of what many of the common words used within the education sector and at Wintec mean.

Ākonga

The Māori word for learners or students

Alumni

After you graduate, a tertiary institute considers you part of its alumni.

Campus

The location where a programme is taught.

Co-requisite

A module that, if not already passed, credited, or exempted, must be taken at the same time as the module for which it is specified.

Distance study and remote learning

Students studying by distance study are not required to attend a Wintec campus on a regular basis.

Elective

Some programmes might allow you to undertake elective modules from outside the main programme of study, or even from a different programme altogether.

Enrolment

The formal process, including the payment of fees and other charges if necessary, by which a student is formally registered for a programme and can begin attending classes.

Kaimahi

The Māori word for staff.

Micro-credential

A short course designed for those who are already working within the industry who need to up-skill in best-practice learnings.

Module

A single paper that contributes to an entire qualification.

Moodle

The Wintec student portal for course content, timetables, forum, discussions, assignments, and results.

Orientation

A programme of activities to introduce new students to Wintec and assist in the transition to tertiary study.

Pathway

The different ways you can enter a certain level of study, or a specific programme.

Placement

A work-related experience at an external organisation where you will apply the skills and knowledge you learn in your programme to practical work.

Pre-requisite

A module that must be passed or credited before you can enrol in the module for which the pre-requisite is specified.

Programme

The qualification/course you are enrolled in, eg Bachelor of Design.

Qualification

A certificate, diploma, or degree awarded following the successful completion of a programme of study.

Semester

The Wintec teaching year is divided into two main semesters. Semester 1 is the equivalent of the first two secondary school terms, and Semester 2, the equivalent of the last two terms in the school year. Some programmes will also offer summer school, or Semester 3.

Transfer of credit

Transfer of credit (TOC) is the process of assessing and awarding credit towards a programme based on past formal and informal learning.

Undergraduate

Usually refers to first-time university programmes and bachelor's degrees.

Whānau

The Māori word for family.

Important Information

Code of Practice

When students come to study at Wintec, we have an important responsibility to ensure that those students are well informed, safe and properly cared for. Wintec is a signatory to The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021, published by the New Zealand Ministry of Education.

Accident Insurance

Accident Compensation Corporation provides injury and accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs.

Additional Costs

It is important that you pay for the full costs of all services requested along with your tuition fees payment. A receipt will only be issued once full payment has been received by Wintec. At the time of printing your total living expenses required per year for Visa purposes is \$20,000 NZD. Some programmes have additional expenses such as books, stationery, uniforms, catering equipment and assignment materials. Prices vary so please enquire on application to a programme. Textbooks are usually between \$75 to \$110 each and some courses have additional independent activity fees.

Attendance

You must attend 100% of your classes. If you miss a class due to health, obtain a medical certificate and give it to your tutor as soon as you return to class. Missing class will affect your visa renewal.

Complaints Process

If your complaint is not resolved by our internal process you can contact the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) who will manage the student complaint.

NZQA assesses the standard of education for tertiary education organisations through a regular system of external evaluation and review (EER). Through periodic EER, tertiary education organisations are held accountable to their students, employers, funders, quality assurance bodies and other interested parties. Eligibility for Health Services

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment. Full details on entitlements to publicly funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health, and can be viewed on their website at moh.govt.nz.

Medical and Travel Insurance

All international students (including groups of students) must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while living and/or studying in New Zealand. Assuming you have chosen to take the Wintec arranged StudentSafe insurance, your cover will commence 30 days before your programme start date. If you arrive in New Zealand earlier than this, you will need to organise your own insurance, or contact the Student Enrolment Centre to start your StudentSafe insurance earlier email international@wintec.ac.nz

StudentSafe insurance pays the costs associated with most medical consultations and prescriptions. It also covers out travel.

IELTS

For information on IELTS please refer to the Academic Requirements. In all cases, IELTS assessments must be no less than two years old at the time of application, and you cannot combine test results.

Immigration

As a parent or family member of a Wintec student, we automatically recognise you as a part of our extended family.

Refund Policy

By accepting a place in a programme or paying fees at Wintec, you enter a contract with Wintec for the period of the programme. This means there is an obligation to pay the fee for one year or the length of the programme if less than one year.
