If you're a New Zealand citizen planning to study at Mount Royal University (MRU) for one semester, you do not need a study permit, as these are only required for programmes longer than six months. For a stay of six months or less, all you need is an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), which costs just \$7 CAD.

If you are a 2nd year student or higher in a degree programme with a B Grade average, you can apply to do a student exchange exchange. Mount Royal University has the following options for your study:

How to apply

Step 1: Speak with your programme manager about the possibility of doing a Student Exchange and if you can earn cross-credits with the programme you have chosen.

Step 2: Email <u>studyabroad@wintec.ac.nz</u> with the following:

- · Name and Student ID
- · University/Place of study choice
- · Programme name and date you wish you go
- Programme Manager name

Step 3: We will have a meeting to discuss all questions you may have and the application process.

Step 4: Complete the application form and submit supporting documents.

Step 5: Confirm your place for Student Exchange and work with International Centre to prepare you for Student Exchange.

Step 6: Make memories overseas while you study!

Mount Royal University is located in the traditional territories of the Niitsitapi (Blackfoot) and the people of the Treaty 7 region in southern Alberta, which includes the Siksika, the Piikani, the Kainai, the Tsuut'ina and the Îyârhe Nakoda. The traditional Blackfoot name of this place is "Mohkinstsis," which we now call the city of Calgary, also home to the Métis Nation.
