These regulations should be read in conjunction with the Institute's Academic Regulations.

1. Admission and Entry

1.1 Candidates can gain entry to this programme by meeting one of the following criteria:

To be admitted to this programme all applicants must be at least 16 years of age on the date the programme starts, and meet one of the following requirements:

i. University Entrance:

1. NCEA Level 3
2. Three subjects at level 3, made up of:
 - 14 credits in each of three **approved subjects**
3. Literacy - **10 credits at Level 2 or above**, made up of:
 - 5 credits in reading
 - 5 credits in writing
4. Numeracy - **10 credits at Level 1 or above**, made up of:
 - achievement standards - specified achievement standards available through a range of subjects, or
 - unit standards - package of three numeracy unit standards (26623, 26626, 26627- all three required).

Or

- ii. Satisfied the criteria for entrance to a New Zealand University with an equivalent to the above from **another secondary qualification**.

Or

Successful completion of an **approved qualification** at Level 4 or above with a relevant pathway.

Or

Based on Discretionary Entrance

Applicants who do not meet any of the entry options stated above, and think they have what it takes to complete this programme, can apply for 'Discretionary Entrance'. The application is based on the applicant's ability to demonstrate a likelihood to succeed in the programme. The decision is at the discretion of the Head of School/Centre Director or their delegate. The ability to progress into further study depends on how successful the applicant is within the programme they apply and are accepted into under 'Discretionary Entrance'.

1.2 English Language Requirements

Candidates who have English as a second language are required to have an International English Language Test System (IELTS) score of 6 in the academic band, with no individual band score lower than 5.5; or equivalent.

2. Transfer of Credit

- 2.1 100% transfer of credit is available for this programme (both formal transfer of credit and recognition of prior learning) with the exception of the final 30 credit capstone Professional Accounting Project course.
- 2.2 Graduates of the following qualifications may seek to recognise and transfer credits towards this programme:
- New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 5) (Accounting strand) [Ref: 2459] to a maximum of 120 credits
 - New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 6) (Accounting strand) [Ref: 2460] number of available credits subject to equivalence of course outcomes

3. Programme Requirements

- 3.1 Every candidate for the Bachelor of Accounting shall to the satisfaction of the Academic Board follow a programme of study for a period of normally not less than three years.
- 3.2 Each candidate's programme will comprise all modules as listed in Section 6 of these regulations, totaling a minimum of 360 credits.

4. Completion of the Programme

- 4.1 A candidate may take up to ten years to complete this programme, unless an extension is granted by special permission of the Group Director, or designated equivalent.

5. Award of the Qualification

- 5.1 Candidates who successfully complete the requirements of this programme will be eligible for the award of the Bachelor of Accounting.
