These regulations should be read in conjunction with the Institute's Academic Regulations.

- 1. Admission and Entry
 - 1.1. General Academic Admission
 - a) Candidates are required to have a bachelor's degree in Computing or Information Technology or a related subject area, with a grade average at level 7 of B or better in the final year of full-time study, or equivalent part-time study; or
 - b) An equivalent qualification as considered by the Centre's Postgraduate Programme Committee.
 - 1.2. Selection Criteria

Every candidate will attend a selection interview/hui and may attend with whānau support.

1.3. Special Admission

Domestic applicants aged 20 years or above who have not met the General Admission or entry requirements for a programme, but whose skills, education or work experience indicate that they have a reasonable chance of success¹ may be eligible for Special Admission. Special admission will be granted at the discretion of the relevant Head of School/Centre Director or designated nominee. Such applicants may be required to successfully complete a foundation, bridging or tertiary introductory programme as a condition of entry into higher level programmes.

1.4. English Language Requirements

Candidates who have English as a second language are required to have an International English Language Test System (IELTS) score of 6.5 in the academic band, with no individual band score lower than 6.0; or equivalent.

2. Transfer of Credit

- 2.1. Transfer of credit at postgraduate level is on a case-by-case basis but will not normally exceed 50% of the programme. Note that no module may count towards more than two qualifications.
- 3. Programme Requirements
 - 3.1. Every candidate for the Postgraduate Certificate in Applied Information Technology shall to the satisfaction of the Academic Board follow a programme of study for a period of normally not less than one semester, or an equivalent programme of part-time study.
 - 3.2. Each candidate's programme of study will comprise the compulsory module as listed in section 6, Group A of these regulations; and study of approved elective modules as listed in section 6 Group B of these regulations, for a further 45 credits.
 - 3.3. All candidates must achieve a minimum of 60 credits at level 8.
- 4. Completion of the Programme

Programme Regulations for:

- 4.1. A candidate may take up to two years to complete this programme, unless an extension is granted by special permission of the Centre Director or authorised nominee or the Centre's Postgraduate Programme Committee.
- 5. Award of the Qualification
 - 5.1. Candidates who successfully complete the requirements in section 3 of these regulations will be awarded the Postgraduate Certificate in Applied Information Technology.
