These regulations should be read in conjunction with the Institute's Academic Regulations.

1. Admission and Entry

1.1. Candidates can gain entry to this programme by meeting one of the following criteria:

- a) Based on study completed at a NZ tertiary institution
 - New Zealand Certificate in Cookery (Level 4) [Ref:2101] with a B grade average overall; or
 - A recognised equivalent qualification; or
 - Equivalent knowledge, skills and experience; or
- b) Based on Discretionary Entrance

Applicants who do not meet any of the entry options stated above, and think they have what it takes to complete this programme, can apply for 'Discretionary Entrance'. The application is based on the applicant's ability to demonstrate a likelihood to succeed in the programme. The decision is at the discretion of the Head of School/Centre Director or their delegate. The ability to progress into further study depends on how successful the applicant is within the programme they apply and are accepted into under 'Discretionary Entrance'.

1.2 Selection Criteria

Candidates may be required to take part in a selection interview process

1.3 English Language Requirements

Candidates who have English as a second language are required to have an International English Language Test System (IELTS) score of 5.5, with no individual band score lower than 5.0; or equivalent.

2. Transfer of Credit

2.1 100% transfer of credit is available for this programme (both formal transfer of credit and recognition of prior learning).

3. Programme Requirements

3.1 Every candidate for the Culinary Arts Year 2 programme shall to the satisfaction of the Academic Board follow a programme of study for a period of normally not less than one year.

3.2 Each candidate's programme will comprise all modules as listed in Section 6 of these regulations, totalling a minimum of 120 credits.

4. Completion of the Programme

4.1 A candidate may take up to two years to complete this programme, unless an extension is granted by special permission of the Centre Director, or designated equivalent.

5. Award of the Qualification

5.1 Candidates who successfully complete the requirements of this programme will be eligible for the award of the New Zealand Diploma in Cookery (Advanced) (Level 5) Cookery strand.
