These regulations should be read in conjunction with the Institute's Academic Regulations.

1. Transition Arrangements

- 1.1 There is an underpinning principle in the application of these transition regulations that no student will be disadvantaged by these arrangements;
- 1.2 This programme is replacing the following qualifications:
 - a) FT0101 – Certificate in Trade Technology (Level 3);
 - b) TE0905 – Certificate in Building (Level 4);
 - c) TE1006 – Certificate in Pre-Trade Painting (Level 2);
 - d) TE1501 – Certificate in Pre-Trade Painting (Level 3).
- 1.3 All students enrolling for the first time from January 2018 must enrol in the new Construction Trade Skills Level 3 programme leading to the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Level 3) with strands;
- 1.4 Students currently enrolled in the qualifications listed in clause 1.2 a) – d) can seek advice from the Group Director, or designated nominee, and may be able to transition across to the new Construction Trade Skills Level 3 programme (TC1801) effective January 2018; **or**
- 1.5 Will need to complete the requirements of FT0101 by 31 January 2020; TE0905 by 31 May 2019; TE1006 by 31 May 2019; or TE1501 by 31 May 2019.

2. Admission and Entry

- 2.1 **General Academic Admission**
There is open entry to this programme although students must demonstrate a reasonable likelihood of success.
- 2.2 **Selection Criteria**
 - a) Candidates may be required to undertake a Needs Assessment to help identify any support they may need in order to be successful in the programme.
 - b) To meet legal and health requirements, candidates must be physically able to carry out the practical components of the programme.
- 2.3 **English Language Requirements**
Candidates who have English as a second language are required to have an International English Language Test System (IELTS) score of 5, with no individual band score lower than 5; or equivalent.

3. Transfer of Credit

- 3.1 100% transfer of credit is available for this programme (both formal transfer of credit and recognition of prior learning).

4. Programme Requirements

- 4.1 Every candidate for the Construction Trade Skills Level 3 programme shall to the satisfaction of the Academic Board follow a programme of study for a period of normally not less than one semester for the Allied Trades strand; or not less than one year for the Carpentry strand.
- 4.2 Each candidate's programme will comprise all core modules and all modules in their chosen strand (Allied Trades or Carpentry) as listed in Section 7 of these regulations, totalling 30 credits, plus the credits specified in the strand.
- 4.3 Candidates undertaking the Allied Trades strand of the Construction Trade Skills Level 3 programme will complete all modules listed in Tables 7.1 and 7.2 in Section 7 of these regulations, totalling 60 credits.
- 4.4 Candidates undertaking the Carpentry strand of the Construction Trade Skills Level 3 programme will complete all modules listed in Tables 7.1 and 7.3 in Section 7 of these regulations, totalling 120 credits.
- 4.5 As some of the practical components within this programme are considered high risk, students will be required to submit to an initial drug screen, and may be required to submit to further drug screening if there is reasonable cause to suspect a student is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, as per Wintec's Drug & Alcohol Policy (OP-16/04).

5. Completion of the Programme

- 5.1 A candidate may take up to four years to complete this programme, unless an extension is granted by special permission of the Group Director, or designated equivalent.

6. Award of the Qualification

- 6.1 Candidates who successfully complete the requirements of this programme will be eligible for the award of the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Level 3) with a strand in Allied Trades or Carpentry.
