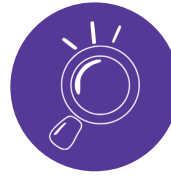

The Waikato Trades Academy (WTA) is a secondary-tertiary partnership between secondary schools and Wintec. The objective is to assist students in gaining industry relevant experience and credits within a Vocational Pathway that interests them, while still studying at secondary school.

Students enrolled in the WTA must still attend secondary school and keep up with their normal school work. The unit standards achieved at the WTA will count towards NCEA Level 1 or 2.

The Social and Community Services are continuously growing and the roles within this sector are essential for community well-being, its all about enabling and support, helping people at the most critical times in their lives. It can be exciting, personally rewarding, and physically and emotionally demanding. The range of jobs is huge – from monitoring and protecting people and property (as in corrections, defence, or fire fighting) to caring for people in need (as in health care, community and social work, medicine, or therapy).

Once your enrolment is confirmed you will receive a confirmation letter from your school outlining your start date, procedures for absences, and contact details for your support person at WTA.
